contacts the speaker, communicates with the Treasurer for payment, communicates any special needs in relationship to the presentation, provides information to the newsletter in advance of the meeting, and introduces the speaker. This position is necessary to provide quality programming for our bimonthly meetings.

Exhibition Committee – Shelley Aquino Brandon graciously agreed to chair the last exhibit. This position remains open. Many individuals are willing and continue to volunteer to assist with hanging and take-down. A Chair for the Hudson Hospital exhibition (not judged or juried) is necessary for this fall. The 2013 exhibit location is already scheduled at Bloomington Art Center. The Exhibit Chair helps (or works with other volunteers) to create the prospectus, takes in registration forms and creates a master list, works with the judge on awards, arranges for volunteers for drop-off, take-down, and the reception, arranges food/drink for the reception, coordinates with the exhibition location, and other tasks associated with staging an exhibition.

Board Secretary – The secretary to the board attends the meetings, takes notes, provides a summary to the newsletter, and reads the notes at the following meeting. This task requires a minimum of time providing a service to the board, particularly the President, by allowing the board to concentrate on decision making.

President (as of January 2013) – I have taken on a two-year commitment as the President, which will expire the end of December. Although I have asked, I have yet to have anyone say yes to take on this task. A President assists to coordinate the tasks of the Program, Exhibition, Workshop, Publicity, Treasurer, Membership, and Newsletter functions along with other miscellaneous tasks. Although six board meetings have been scheduled in the past, a lesser number of board meetings can be scheduled. Average computer skills are necessary since email communication works best. An individual who understands some of the above functions and is excited about our society would be an ideal candidate. As President, I have met and gotten to know our membership and received numerous opportunities as a result of this position. If you attend the 2013 IAPS convention, additional opportunities are available to meet other society presidents and to represent our membership. It has been a pleasure to be your President and anyone taking on this position will certainly enjoy being in this position. I'd like to leave the society in good hands when I exit.
