From the President



During several recent conversations artists have mentioned that they haven't painted in ???

months or in a year. Is there an artist who hasn't experienced this?

This is more common than you might realize and it's OK to talk about it. Sometimes it happens that life changes dictate that our just living consumes all of our attention. Beginning to make art again might require new approaches.

Sometimes we can't explain it. I, too, have experienced "not knowing how to begin again, feeling stuck, believing something has to change but not knowing where to begin." Here are some things to think about.

When I began my career as a full-time artist I made a decision that I was not SELF employed, instead, I worked for my Creator. Therefore, I had to show up for work and invest my time each day like everyone else. I still have to remember this.

Like many "performers" after a big event or after I've poured intensely into a particular project, artistic or not, it's very difficult for me to get back into that creative sweet spot. First, I know it helps to have a new endeavor scheduled in the months ahead. It's easier to keep the truck moving than it is to get it moving from 'park'.

Moving Past "*the block*"

Next, my family knows there will be a season of "nest building" when I rearrange my studio, stir around like a puppy getting ready to settle down. It always happens. When that includes difficulty deciding what to paint, I often return to a theme that intrigued me earlier, revisit it and move out from there. Working always generates more ideas. It often means beginning with more realism before I launch into something that is not as well defined. I might not make a masterpiece but just starting helps. I have to face the fear and send it out.

We all have to face these seasons. Perhaps you can share approaches with us. Meanwhile, grasping that pastel and making marks is essential. Having new paintings means we're ready when opportunities appear. We have more great shows this Fall. Nearby, the LCPS show in Stillwater is this month -- enter right away. International Association of Pastel Societies (IAPS) Online Show accepts entries through September 15. (www.iapspastel. org for information) And the IAPS Biennial Convention June 4 - 9, 2019 registration will be available very soon at the same link. Details of the convention exhibit will be included. And join us September 11 for the portrait demo -fellowship and new ideas are great inspiration.

Suzann Beck BIOGRAPHY

Whether painting a commissioned portrait, a figurative piece, or a portrait of a single rose, Suzann has the unique ability to capture the essence and spirit of a subject and combine it with masterful likeness. Her inspiration and passion comes from the classical old masters, and she is particularly influenced by the Russian painters of the 19th century. Intrigued and motivated by the depth and craft of masterworks hundreds of years old, Suzann works to understand classical methods and disciplines and leverage them with contemporary practices and sensibilities to create representational realism. Suzann Beck holds a Bachelors of Fine Arts degree from Moorhead State University, Moorhead MN, and studied portraiture with atelier-trained painter Judith Anthony, Plymouth, MN, classical glazing technique portraiture with Jeffery Hurinenko, St. Paul, MN, and figure drawing with Michael Mentler, Dallas, Texas. Suzann serves as the Minnesota Ambassador for the Portrait Society of America, and teaches painting and drawing classes in her Northeast Minneapolis studio, theParamount Center for the Visual Arts, St. Cloud, MN, White Bear Center for the Arts in WhiteBear Lake, MN, and Wet Paint Art Store, St. Paul, MN.

Her paintings are inspired by nature walks and careful observation. She uses photos which are then combined and manipulated to compose her unique style of abstracted realism. She is an enthusiastic and encouraging teacher who guides her students to achieve success The cost for three days is \$375 for members and \$400 for non-members. This is a studio class, which will be held at the New Brighton Center, and includes refreshments each morning. Local Color: Making the Most of What Nature Gives You

This class is for landscape painters who sometimes feel constrained by an overwhelming blue/green palette, the dullness of the light, the color limits of the season, or less than perfect photos to work from. In this workshop, we will take an experiential, non-academic approach to maximizing your color skills. By working with your photos to create pastel landscapes over a watercolor base, Colette will guide you through raising your color perception, increasing your color acuity, and expanding your color vocabulary. Using direct instruction, numerous examples, and demonstrations, she will launch your class work with a fresh approach to keeping your colors clean and effective. Ms. Smith generously shares from her nearly 25 years of pastel experience through lots of individualized instruction keyed to your intent. The 3 days will be loaded with tips, techniques and thoughtful approaches to developing your art as you continue on your own.
