CAPTURING THE LIGHT - Christopher Copeland

Tuesday, May 10th - 7-9pm at the New Brighton Community Center

Christopher will demonstrate his process for successful plein air painting. What he looks for in a subject and how to simplify the scene and crop for maximum drama. He will share his plein air set up (it is unbelievably compact!) and how he gets started to best capture the scene. He will also share his thoughts on how to create atmospheric perspective and finally a discussion on brush work and edges.



Christopher is a Graduate of the College of Visual Arts in St

Paul. He is an award-winning artist and in addition to his exhibits in the Twin Cities, he has exhibited his work in New York, Boston and Ohio and has displayed in galleries in Seattle, Scottsdale and Santa Fe. He paints primarily in oil and pastel.



Painting outdoors on location, Copeland's main concern is to record nature's transient moments where the light is fleeting and most effective. Using loose but controlled brushwork (or strokes), he works quickly to capture the atmmospheric effects of light, shadow and color as they play on the land.

He is a regular Artist-Instructor at the White Bear Center for the Arts and has an upcoming class "Plein Air Painting in Pastel" May 4-25th, 2022 - Wednesdays 1:30-4:00pm. You can find more information at <u>www.whitebeararts.org</u>.

JULY - Join us for the summer paint out!

Come join us on Tuesday, July 12, 2022 from 3:00 pm - 7:00pm, for our annual paint-out get together. We will gather in Thomas Lake Park in Eagan. Regardless of where you are coming from, you can find you way to I-35E or I-35W and go south of the metro area, taking the Cliff Road exit. Go East to Pilot Knob Road, then north to the Thomas Lake Park entrance on the west side. No parking permit is required. Park in the smaller lot on the right side. Go to the 2 or 3 picnic table area, not the large one. There will be several people there to greet you when you arrive.

Thomas Lake Park is an interesting place to visit with many possibilities for some plein aire painting! There is a large lake, smaller lake and several ponds in the park. What to bring: an easel & your pastel supplies. Bring a beverage & a snack for yourself. Be dressed for the weather. Sanitary facilities and drinking water are available at the park.

SEPTEMBER - Group Critique Session

September 13th - 7:00-9:00 - New Brighton Community Center. In addition to a short demonstration, we will have a group critique session, with a special guest artist to guide us through the process. Those who participated in the summer paint-out session may bring their work for a critique. If you did not attend the paint-out, you can still bring in one of your paintings that was completed this past summer and never entered into an exhibition or competition. Expressive Pastels: Loosen Up and Add some Spice to your Paintings

Three day studio pastel workshop with Karen Margulis PSA IAPS- MC

It has been said that as artists we are either moving toward or away from abstraction. No matter where we fall on this journey we can all benefit from ideas to help us create more expressive paintings. I am always striving to interpret my subject by including my own personal touch rather than a copying the reference or painting exactly what I see.

On day one of the workshop I will share some of the ways I have discovered that help me paint in a more expressive 'loose' manner. I will introduce a simple method for a successful pastel painting from the planning stage to the addition of those final important spices!

On the second day we will explore the use of underpaintings and how they contribute to more expressive pastel paintings. I will demonstrate two different underpainting techniques. Students will use an underpainting to develop their paintings.

On the 3rd day we will continue to explore techniques that will lead to more expressive paintings and we will put all of the lessons together with some fun painting exercises. We will finish the workshop with a feedback session.

There will be demos, handouts and plenty of individual help at the easel during the workshop.

Plein Air Painting In Pastel

July 5-8, 2022 Tuesday-Friday, 4 days, 9:30 a.m.- 4:30 p.m.

Supply Fee: \$0 to ?- your choice! I will bring some specific pastel supplies that you may wish to buy and try out. It is difficult to find the best supplies for pastel anywhere but the finest art supply stores in large cities or online. You can try individual sticks and papers this way to decide what you would like to add to your kit.

Class Description: Paint outside with pastel in beautiful Grand Marais. The basics of outdoor painting will be discussed throughout the week. You will learn to choose your own subject, improve

your skills in design, composition and drawing, consider painting fundamentals, and more. Instructor demonstrations, personal assistance at your easel and group critiques will give us a chance to learn as we explore plein air (outdoor) painting in a fun and supportive environment.

Due to Covid concerns this class will be held outdoors as much as possible, please have your Covid vaccinations and booster and be prepared to mask indoors depending on current covid protocols. We will have access to the recreation center in the Grand Marais Municipal Campground for our initial meeting and group gatherings, or when the weather is uncooperative. Do plan to bring all the equipment you will need for your own painting set-up and comfort during our days of painting, watching my demonstrations and enjoying the beauty of Grand Marais and Cook County.

When you register for the class you will receive a supply list to help with planning and our first morning meeting location. You will want a car or transportation to get to our painting locations although many will be close to town and the campground.

The Grand Marais Art Fair is Saturday and Sunday following our class week if you want to stay and enjoy that also.

If enough class members are interested we can add a night paint on Monday night, July 4, to our activities. If you want to try a night paint just let me know and if I hear from several of you I will send info about that. May be a dusk paint because the sun goes down fairly late in July, maybe something like 7-9 so we aren't up too late the night before class starts!



Instructor Bio: Lisa Stauffer received her Master's in Design (University Of Minnesota) and studied illustration at Parson's School Of Design (NYC). She works and teaches in a wide variety of media. Lisa now paints primarily in pastel with a special focus on painting en plein air to indulge her fascination with light and color in Minnesota's beautiful north shore landscape. Lisa holds Master Circle status with the International Association Of Pastel Societies and is a Signature member of the Pastel Society Of America.

HOW TO POST PICTURES TO WEBSITE

All LCPS members are entitled to have their own page in the LCPS showcase, featuring up to three images of their pastel work.

The images in the showcase are JPEG files, and have been resized so that the longer dimension, whether width or height, is 600 pixels. Images larger than this may be submitted, but they'll be resized to the standard size. Smaller images should not be submitted, because they'll lose quality when resized. DPI settings, if any, don't matter, because images will always be displayed pixel-for-pixel.

For each image, the painting's title should be provided. The dimensions of the original painting in inches will also be displayed if provided.

You should identify one of the images as your "featured" image. This one will appear as a small square thumbnail beside your name on the Showcase page, and will also go into the pool from which the ten home-page images will be randomly selected. Ideally, it will be an image from which a good square thumbnail can be derived: not unusually tall or wide in aspect ratio.

In addition to providing your name as you want it to appear at the top of your page, you may submit one or two more lines of information to go under your name, typically web site, email, and/or home city.

THE MINIMALIST'S PLEIN AIR SET-UP

PASTELS - Warm and cool version of primary, secondary and tertiary colors in three values. A few mid-value grays. Any secure box will work. Use foam or cornmeal to protect them.

Itoya profolio filled with pre-cut paper. Place completed work back into the page sleeve to protect it. Comes in variety of sizes.

Clip board or other hard surface

Clips or tape to hold your paper in place

Pencil or markers with index cards for thumbnails and value studies

Plastic gloves and baby wipes for clean-up.

A large towel or blanket. Can be used as a surface to sit on or to cover your knees if seated with surface on your lap.

Keep in your car: hat, water, bug spray and sunblock.
