Cultivating Curiousity

Each year I chose an annual theme word. Last year my word was ABUNDANCE and it served me well so it took some time to find a new word for 2025. Drumroll, Wendy's 2025 word is CURIOSITY!! A year exploring new ideas, processes, and places. To ask: Why? Why not? What if? And, to embrace the discomfort that comes with learning and

applying new skills.

Here are some of the reported benefits of a curious mindset:

- Promotes resilience and flexibility
- Accelerates learning and improves memory
- Encourages empathy and natural curiosity about others
- Encourages exploration and innovation
- Naturally opposed to complacency and boredom
- Sparks joy and FUN!

In my art practice, the goal is to release expectations and embrace feeling awkward and uncomfortable as a requirement of accelerated learning. I've been experimenting with a wide variety of mediums, techniques and genres with the intention of integrating what I learn into my pastel work. But for now, it's all just for fun as I make a lot of art, much of it only valuable as a learning tool!

I'm especially excited about our two artist workshops this year. Curiosity has clearly been a driving force for both artists. They have each spent decades as professional artists pursuing a wide variety of subject matter and using multiple mediums (often simultaneously) to tell their stories. If you have spent any time around Fred Somers, you know he is ALWAYS asking, "what if?"

Part of my challenge is to revisit my art practice goals with a fresh eye. Why and how I share my art. What part of my art practice brings me joy, or doesn't? What might I do differently?

Who could I turn to for guidance and coaching? Our March Member Meeting will be a great starting point as we welcome Andy Sturdevant from Springboard for the Arts to talk about his art career.

I'm currently reading The Well Lived Life: A 102-Year-Old Doctor's Six Secrets To Health and Happiness by Gladys Mc-Garvey, and her driving philosophy is to live her life as "A joyful, participatory engagement that extends to every breath and every moment....When life gets tough, we don't drag our feet; instead we become curious and we engage even more." Amen sister!

I'm applying a curious approach to other areas as well. What else might be possible? How might we do better? What would happen if we do this instead? Recently we welcomed two new LCPS Sponsors - Terry Ludwig and Diane Townsend Pastels and continue to work with others as a way to keep our membership costs affordable. We are also looking at venue options and virtual offerings for future meetings.

What new interests are you pursuing? I'm looking forward to seeing you at our March meeting and hearing a little bit about what you've been up to.

Allison Ecklund was not able to make it, so Andy was able to step forward and do the presentation. Andy works with Springboard for the Arts in St. Paul. He is also the Artist Resource Manager and Coordinator for the Minnesota Lawyers for the Arts.



Andy Sturdevant (he/him) is a writer, artist, and designer living in Minneapolis. He is the author of four full-length nonfiction books, including the Minnesota Book Award-nominated book Closing Time: Saloons, Taverns, Dives and Watering Holes of the Twin Cities (with Bill Lindeke). He graduated with a Bachelors of Fine Art in painting in 2004 from the Hite Art Institute at the University of Louisville. Andy has written about art, history and culture for a variety of Twin Cities-based publications and websites. He is the recipient of grants from the Metropolitan Regional Arts Council and Forecast Public Arts, awards from the Minnesota Media & Publishing Association and the Minnesota Professional Chapter of the Society of Professional Journalists.

His presentation will cover the basic tasks needed to start your own art business He will talk about Naming your business, setting up the structure, how to create a business plan and the taxes associated with the ubusiness. Mostly the focus will be on creating an LLC.




Members Meeting

During our three-hour session, one person had shown up, thinking we were from the "Lake County" pastel group. That is his county and he never heard of us! Ha, the sign on the door was misspelled. Two other guests showed up who work at the New Brighton Community Center and they always help set up the room, but never had a chance to see what goes on. They were delighted to see our works in progress. One of them was a student who attends Creighton University in Nebraska. He was very interested in joining our organization, but wants to finish his college work first. He may join us again during the summer months.

Meanwhile, one of us was touching up on several paintings that had not been finished. Another person was totally experimenting and without a photograph, totally made up her painting, based on what colors she wanted to experiment with. The other four of us were starting new paintings altogether. Our group discussion (in between all of our painting) covered so many topics, to include how much different is a beginner from a professional, when in fact, we are all seeking new knowledge about the art form? Lisa Stauffer introduced us all to a free software program called "Chromatic" that helps one develop a good eye for color and its many shades. We shared funny stories about our experiences and teachers we have worked with. Several mentioned that Lorenzo Chavez is a great artist and teacher. He will be doing our workshop this coming Spring. We were having so much fun that the three hours just flew by. Maybe the next time, we'll see YOU there!

LORENZO CHAVEZ WORKSHOP May 14, 15 & 16, 2025

The Lake Country Pastel Society is excited to host internationally known award-winning painter, Lorenzo Chavez for our Spring 2025 workshop! It will be an IN-STUDIO workshop Wednesday-Friday, May 14-16 at the New Brighton Community Center, New Brighton, MN. It is almost full, so don't hesitate to register!

Chavez is a renowned fine artist specializing in pastel and oil landscapes. He is also a sought-after instructor who teaches workshops across the United States.

Born and raised in New Mexico, Lorenzo Chavez has been a professional artist for over 35 years. His first inspirations and foundations as a young artist were formed by the local landscape and the art history of the area. Lorenzo now makes his home in Parker, Colorado and uses his location as a base to travel and paint throughout the region and across the country.

His award-winning work is featured in prestigious exhibitions, galleries and publications, as well as private and corporate collections throughout the US and internationally. He has been a recipient of awards from notable groups



as the Pastel Society of America, California Art Club, and the American Impressionist Society and is an active member of Rendezvous of Art, Signature member of The Plein Air Painters of America and the Pastel Society of America, the California Art Club Signature Member, American Impressionist Society, and the Pastel Society of Spain.







Lorenzo's workshop will focus on the fundamentals of landscape painting... shape, line, values, colors, edges, emotional involvement, and atmospheric and linear perspective. The importance of simplifying the landscape and composition will be emphasized. His workshop will offer lots of individual attention with daily demos and an opportunity for relaxed and inspiring group discussions. His goal is to "awaken your artistic vision."

Chavez was recently published in PLEIN AIR TODAY...

Exposing our sight and other senses to situations that may not be part of our existing routine allows us to step out of our pattern, breaking norms of creative comfort. It encourages what Chavez refers to as "a beginner's mind" (full of curiosity and wonder), and allows us to take on the unknown in order to grow the seeds of what is already feeding an artistic practice.

I've had some success in getting my work out in the public lately. I credit my participation in the Minnetonka Center for the Arts Holiday fair in 2022 and 2023, because this led to my being contacted by the art curator at the Unitarian Universalist Church of Minnetonka. The church building is relatively new, and they invite artists to display their art for three month periods on a long wall in their beautiful, light-filled sanctuary - and the work can be offered for sale. I have 16 pieces there now through the middle of April.

The art curator, Christy Dachtelet, has become a real advocate for me and she first suggested I apply to the Landscape Arboretum of MN to have an exhibit there; I was accepted and will exhibit along with another artist for two months this summer. Then she suggested I contact Gallery 360 in Minneapolis (at 50th and Xerxes) and I have been invited to display/sell a few pieces in early March as well as participate in a bigger show in mid-April.

I tell you all of this in order to encourage others who are interested in selling their work to seek opportunities when you can, as you never know what might come of it. I started painting in pastel two years ago, have had a website for almost two years, but have had very few sales from it. I think it took getting my work in front of actual eyeballs to begin to have some success. I didn't even begin exploring trying art (first with watercolor and then a bit of acrylic) until the pandemic, and never intended to make any money from it - it was purely for my own enjoyment and satisfaction. And I will continue painting for those reasons even if I never sell another piece......I've given many, many pieces away and that is also extremely satisfying.





Greetings, Fellow Pastelists -

February, 2025 held a surprise for me - the joys of playing with pastel pigments returned! It may have been art festival hard deadlines, the toned canvases sitting unused in Studio B, or the quiet whispers from hundreds of pastel sticks and pans idling their way in the main studio. Who knows? One or more of these three resulted in the unexpected beginning of a new series of paintings! Not bear portraits, not bears sitting in moonlight, not a bear or two dancing.

I somehow felt the need to create imagined spaces of peace and beauty. Welcoming, mysterious places where one could relax and wander - while discovering the mysteries held in shadow and light. Fantasy forests created primarily from those tiny bits and pieces of pigment that just could be discarded yet. Using toned canvases instead of the usual substrates has been interesting. I am experimenting with various fixatives throughout the process. Taking notes.

Two pastel paintings are finished, and a colorful oil painting in the same theme is sitting on the easel. Life Lesson: Keep those resting art supplies around just a while longer. their siren songs may lead you back to the studio again. I'm back playing those bits of color those - and happier for the doing!
