Dive Deep, Swim Far

I was in my third day of preparing for a new class curriculum and I declared to my husband, "I don't think I'm going to teach anymore after this quarter. It is just so much work, and it takes me away from my painting." He sweetly smiled and said, "Whatever you feel is right for you, but you will do a great job."

it was not about the time or the effort. It was about fear. I was suffering from a bout of 'Imposter Syndrome'

"Be not the slave of your own past-plunge into the sublime seas, dive deep, and swim far" Ralph Waldo Emerson

"Wendy, put on your big girl underwear and get to work!" (Yes, I actually said this to myself every single day when I started my business back in 2001) I knew it was simply a good indication that I was embarking on a situation that would help me to grow.

I kept PREPARING: Thinking through my painting process, seeking the 'why' in photo references, practicing thumbnails, trying out different color combinations, laying in underpaintings, painting small studies, and finally distilling all this into a PowerPoint and handouts.

When I was done, I was reminded of the 'why' behind 'why' I was teaching - to share knowledge with others as they travel on their own journey.

But there was another unexpected benefit to all that work. I was reminded that when we are willing to try new things, to make riskier choice, that's when we set the stage for new discoveries. And when it comes to our art, maybe even creative breakthroughs.

Suddenly with all the emphasis on fundamentals, several ideas that had been brewing seemed possible.

It is never easy to learn new things (whether by our choice, or outside our control) but growth seldom is. Regardless of the outcome, those new skills get added to our resume and knowing that we pushed through our fear, bring confidence that we can face new challenges.

Is there something that's been holding you back from taking the next step in your artistic journey? Is there a little bit of fear that is a cue to drive over that speed bump and keep going? Take it from me: You can do it.

Members Meeting

Recap of the March 11 Presentation

Andy Sturdevant from Springboard for the Arts, gave a presentation on how to start your own business. He began with a brief history of his own artistic endeavors, which included working with pastels. He began with the question: Why would you turn your artistic work into a business? It would help to increase your income through sales, not grants. The other question posed was: Am I a hobbyist or professional and why? The difference is how one approaches losing money. As a professional you must create the mind set of making a profit. A professional thinks in terms of NOT losing money.

With the profit motive in mind, one has the option of choosing to be registered as an LLC (LIMITED LIABILITY CORPORATION) or DBA (DOING BUSINESS AS). Your first priority would be to determine a name for you business (and website or other social media platforms). You can do both a state wide search for any business that has that name already, and a national search. This will help you decide on the official name. Once you have a name, you register first with the state and get a state ID number. Then use that information to acquire your federal ID, or EIN for tax purposes. A business planning document, or tax planning document helps you manage the business throughput the year. Most sales will require that you pay taxes, so using an e-commerce website will help you manage those taxes. Cash sales get tricky and it is easier to manage the records using checks, credit cards or doing sales online. It is important to keep track of your monthly list of activities related to your business. It will help you (or whomever does your taxes) at the end of the year. Andy responded to all questions as the discussion continued through the presentation. In the end he handed out a form that was the beginning of a business planning sheet. He also mentioned the services that Springboard offered, all of which were free to artists. He was very encouraging about the whole project. He mentioned that having an email list of your buyers, or people interested in your work, was the best way to encourage future sales of your work.



FRED SOMERS WORKSHOP OCTOBER 13, 14 & 15, 2025


'Paint what you love, walk in the light." ~Fred Somers

The Lake Country Pastel Society is excited to announce that our very own Fred Somers will be teaching a three day in-studio workshop on Monday - Wednesday, October 13-15, 2025. It will be held in his home studio near Northfield, MN.

Fred has painted in pastels for almost 50 years and has been a member of LCPS since its beginning 25 years ago. After teaching drawing, painting and printmaking at St. Olaf and Carlton College, he moved to his farm home studio and began his adventure as a freelance artist, painting in pastel and oil. His paintings, known for their peaceful sensitivity, reflect themes from the land. In Fred's words, "I love painting woods, fields and streams, interpreting vistas and intimate views." His pastel paintings of the Big Woods State Park, which is near his home, were chosen for the 1996 Minnesota State Park permit design. Fred continues painting as well as teaching workshops throughout the US and in Sweden.



His numerous awards include the 2020 induction into Pastel Society of America Hall of Fame. An IAPS Master and Eminent Pastelist, Fred is also a signature member of the PSA and an Associate of Oil Painters of America. He has been named American Swedish Artist of the Year and Great River Greening's Landscape Artist of the Year. Fred's pastel paintings have been featured in many books, magazines and journals.





This will be a hands-on workshop with demonstrations, slide presentations and plenty of one-on-one instruction. Fred will introduce unique materials and techniques that he has developed. You'll explore new ways of seeing that can enhance your individual style. Working in Fred's studio and gallery, you will be surrounded by his beautiful paintings and immersed in his creative space. An inspiration in and of itself, this will truly enhance the learning process. Each student will have a limited amount of space with a small table.

Paintings must be picked up and dropped off during listed times. (If unavailable on list drop off arrangements must bemade with other LCPS members for drop off at the stated date/time. Put this on your calendar now.)

We will try to organize a list of volunteers to drop-off and pick-up paintings if you are not able to do so on the scheduled dates. But it is always best to reach out to another member directly.

Two weeks after show closes, checks are mailed out, from Frameworks Art Gallery, to those who had a painting sold.

ELIGIBILITY AND RESTRICTIONS

Must be a current Member of LCPS (Membership renewals can be made online.)

Exhibit entry fee is \$20 for 1 piece; \$25 for 2 pieces; \$30 for 3 pieces.

All exhibition sales go through the Frameworks business, with a 40% commission. Artwork does not have to be for sale.

- Paintings must be 85% soft pastels, no oil pastel.
- Artwork must be completed within 2 years of the exhibit's start date.
- Work must not be completed under supervision or classwork.
- Paintings from past exhibitions are not eligible.
- No title or price changes after submission.
- Paintings must be framed, under glass, and ready to hang with wires attached. (No sawtooth hangers).
- Artwork must remain until the end of the show.
- Paintings must be tasteful and respect family viewing. (No nudes).

INSURANCE AND LIABILITY

All Possible care will be taken with your artwork, however, neither LCPS nor Frameworks Art Gallery are responsible for loss or damage to artwork at any time. Frameworks does carry basic insurance, however.

ARTICLE ON JUDGE

Suzann holds a Bachelors of Fine Arts degree from Moorhead State University, Moorhead MN, studied portraiture for 3 years with Jeffery Hurinenko who apprenticed with artist Charles Kapsner who trained at Studio Simi, Florence Italy. Suzann has been studying figure since 2017 with nationally-known draughtsman Michael Mentler, Dallas, Texas, who is viewed by many as a living embodiment of Leonardo DaVinci. As an award-winning oil and pastel portrait painter, Suzann is a sought-after portraiture instructor, serves as an Ambassador for the Portrait Society of America, and organizes

the Minnesota Portrait Network, a resource for the Minnesota members of the Portrait Society of America. Suzann works primarily from life in her Northeast Minneapolis studio where she works with her own apprentices as well as teaching at multiple area art centers in the Minneapolis area and St. Cloud, MN.

Suzann Beck is a Minneapolis-based fine artist working in realism with the mediums of oil, pastel, and charcoal. She specializes in portraiture, with her subject matter ranging from commissioned portraits to figure, still life, and landscape. Suzann is particularly influenced by the Renaissance painters and Russian Itinerants of the 19th century including Repin and Kramskoi.



Suzann says: "This art journey has changed my life in ways I could never have foreseen, and as I came to it later in life and found that age does not determine what you can achieve, I am all the more dedicated to pass on what I've learned in my short painting journey. There's a certain healing that happens when you can give others the opportunities and tools you wish you had in your past journey, and a gift you give to the world when you unlock and nurture the potential students didn't know was possible."






